Vocations Sunday - A Day of Prayer for Vocations: We have too few Priests in Our Diocese at this time. In fact we have too few Priests in Ireland at this time. We need to talk about the scarcity of priests in our homes. We now know that we hadn't enough priests to celebrate the Easter Ceremonies in some parishes. Some priests had Covid, and others had retired or gone to their reward. God is obviously saying something to us, and we should begin to listen. Not only have we a scarcity of Priests but we have a scarcity of faith filled homes. Some marriages are already broken up, and others have stopped the practice of the Faith. Some seem to have lost the faith, and others seem to be losing the faith. This loss of Faith is a great tragedy. The loss of Faith is a tragedy in our own lives, in the lives of our family, and in our society. We see this all around us. We cannot succeed on our own. We need God. We see this in broken marriages. We can see this absence of faith all around us. We have so called partners killed every week. We see many couples living together who are not married. We have people using knives to stab and kill others. We have violence in some homes in our country. We have illegal drugs also causing deaths and violence. Again we see the need for God in our lives and homes. When God is expelled from our homes the devil takes possession. If the faith is not practised by parents it is not handed on to our children, so our children are left without values or ideals. We cannot expect new priests to come from such homes. Priests can only emerge from homes of faith. Without Faith we destroy ourselves, our families, our world, and the future happiness of our children. Let us pray for Happy Homes and for Vocations to the priesthood.
