A: Looking at Authority from the child's viewpoint: Don't spoil me I know I ought not to have all I ask for, I'm only testing you. Don't be afraid to be firm with me. It makes me feel more secure. Don't correct me in front of others. I'll take more notice if you correct me in private. Don't nag, or I'll have to protect myself, by appearing deaf.

Don't make rash promises. I feel badly let down when promises are broken. Don't be inconsistent that completely confuses me. Don't put me off when I ask questions, or I'll think that I am forced to get my information elsewhere. Don't think it beneath your dignity to apologise if you are wrong. An honest apology makes me feel surprisingly warm towards you

But two things I need above all others—understanding and love. If you give me these, the rest will take care of themselves.

B: I am the vine and you are the branches: We need Christ; that is no surprise. But he also needs us. Vine and Branches need each other. But our need of Him is the greater. "Cut off from me you can do nothing", he says.

It is not he who cuts himself off from us. It is we who sometimes cut ourselves off from him through indifference, selfishness or pride.
